Ann Butler, Project Lead for Student Quality Ambassadors (Health Education North West England)

Ann Butler is a registered Adult Nurse. Her background has involved working in accident & emergency when she first qualified but the majority of her time has been within a Cardiothoracic surgical ward and high dependency unit. For the last 5 years Ann has been involved in education and has had the role of a Practice Education Facilitator (PEF) within Aintree University Hospital NHS Foundation Trust and for the last year has been seconded to NHS Health Education North West for 2 days a week to support the development of the Student Quality Ambassadors amongst other smaller projects.



Ela Cernwy, Wales Health Student Forum Clinical Psychology Representative (Bangor University)

Ela Cernwy is a trainee Clinical Psychologist in her second year on the North Wales Clinical Psychology Program. Ela's talk will provide an overview of clinical psychology in healthcare, including the training process and the roles within the NHS working clinically with individuals and teams.

Alison Strode, Therapy Adviser for Wales (Welsh Government)

Alison Strode is the Therapy Advisor for the Welsh Government. Alison qualified as a podiatrist from the Cardiff School of Podiatry in 1979,

has had an extensive career in the NHS and has worked in the private sector. On leaving the NHS after 26 years Alison worked as a Divisional Manager at Skills for Health, the UK wide Sector Skills Council for Health and was the lead manager for Workforce Modernisation. Her work included the UK wide project, Modernising AHPs Careers, a competence based career framework for AHPs which produced tools for identifying the spectrum of skilled AHP professionals needed for AHP expertise to be used to best effect. Latterly at Skills for Health Alison held a wider portfolio including the development of an online skills passport, part of Modernising Nursing careers, before taking up the role with the Welsh Government.

Dr Gareth Morgan, NHS Wales Policy Lead for Older People (Hywel Dda Health Board)

Dr Gareth Morgan has a background in public health and 20 years in NHS. In 2008 he was appointed to post of NSF Project Manager, which included Dignity in Care Programme Secretary and in 2010 was made Honorary research fellow at Cardiff University. In 2012 the post expanded to NHS Wales Policy Lead. Dr. Morgan's interests are varied and include work-based research
